Public Comments:

Tony Cenko said we live at 3458 William Penn Avenue and I'm tired of living next to a landfill, animal house, you name it. I'm tired of living next to it. If the police or George keep getting called to the same house for the same reasons, there should be a hefty fine. . . make it \$1,000 dollar fine. Quite taking it to this Magistrate up here. **Chairman Baker** said, there's a process. . .first of all we have laws, rules and ordinances. Unfortunately we can say it's a \$1,000 fine but it can go to the magistrate and if she doesn't impose that fine, there's nothing we can do about it. **Cenko** said, the magistrate says I feel sorry for you. . .you go there about the noise next door and she brings up about her neighbor cutting wood to heat his house in the winter. Now that being said, that's not a guarantee that things are going to change. **Cenko** said, even the neighbors who live behind St. Johns hear the noise and music. **Baker** said, the Police can stop the noise if it's past a reasonable time. . so if it's after 10 at night . . or even if it's during the day if it's unreasonable. **Cenko** said, it's unreasonable to try to watch a football game Sunday morning with the doors and windows closed and you can't hear because the cars next door have their boom boxes going to 200 decibels. **Baker** said, every issue that comes before us comes down to everyone having a little common courtesy and being a good neighbor. **Solicitor Barbin** said we've hired another attorney to take this case to Cambria County Court. The process could take up to 3 months, but then it gets in front of a judge. **Vice-Chairman Wallet** said, I've seen where they clean up a bunch of stuff and there's a bunch of garbage bags but then it goes back to being just like it was before. **Baker** said, it's not working through the Magistrate so it's going to cost us more money to go to Cambria County Court. . . and that's not right.
