Solicitor Bill Barbin reviewed the low bid received from HRI Inc. and said the bid was fine and could be approved.

Other New Business:

Motion Dreikorn, second Baker to amend the Land Development Plan for CPV Fairview. The change would be going from an 8 foot high chainlink fence with a 1 foot barbwire strand for a total of 9 feet to a 7 foot high chainlink fence and a 1 foot barbwire strand for a total of 8 feet. The motion was opened up to questions or public comment and there was none. A vote was then taken. Vote-2 yes with Wallet abstaining.

Public Comments:

Betty Tomkosky from Beaverdale said, I'm the Grandmother of the little girl that fell in the culvert at the Heritage Festival. I don't know if the EMT's or Fire Company told you about it. They have you walking down from the parking lot to the festival with the yellow caution tape. My granddaughter is 6 years old stepped on a rock and went into your culvert. Her condition. . she wasn't hurt badly. . a few abrasions. The EMT's were great. The Fire Company. . . ok. They didn't have it with construction fence around it. I'm only here because I want it recorded that it wasn't a safe situation.

Teala Dalfanso said, when you turn onto Pike Road West off of Rt. 271 there is a sign that says begin 35 mph speed limit ahead. The rest of the way up Pike Road there are no signs showing where the 35 mph begins. They are posted coming down Pike Road West but not from 271 up. **Chairman Baker** said, we will make sure it's posted.

Debra Noel said, I called up to Nanty Glo and got tapped in along Loraine Road. I went to a Nanty Glo meeting because that's where the payment is going, I thought that's where they would take care of it. **Solicitor Barbin** said, if you have a problem with raw sewage coming out of somebody's property, that's a Township meeting. If it's concerning people to tap into the sewer line, that's Nanty Glo. **Chairman Baker** said, we created the tap-in ordinance. . .we had to and it will be enforced. If it's a problem with raw sewage, you need to see Deborah Sedlmeyer at the Cambria County Sewage Enforcement Agency. **Barbin** said, after the last Nanty Glo meeting, there is only 1 more that needs to make arrangements to tap-in.

Bob Albright said, I want to thank the Supervisors for the pond they put in and I also want to thank anybody who had anything to do with it. . .I especially want to thank Ed Westrick. . he's been as relentless as a dog with a bone to get that pond there for how many years. We're down there about every other day. It's really an asset to the Township. Also, I want to thank Mr. Hirko and the Supervisors for the Heritage Festival. Dave does a hell of a job with the Festival and it's a real asset to the Township. People really give good comments on it. I want to thank anyone who had anything to do with the Festival and I appreciate it. I have one little problem on Old Nanty Glo Road. When it rains, it all comes out on the road instead of the ditch. It may need grated.

Ed Westrick said, there is a story about the Fishing Pond in OurTown and it shows the boy with a 26 inch trout.
