Public Comments:

Ed Smith said, the Township Map that was recently distributed, I thought was very good quality and I wanted to congratulate whomever was responsible for it. Very good job. I had a suggestion that the historical comment section was for the most part authored by Betty Burkhart of the Nanty Glo Journal and it would be appropriate to give credit. Another thing I want to comment on is JETSA and I would like to congratulate JETSA because they've done a good job in eliminating odor in the pump stations with the charcoal filters. The odor at the Pump Station on Harmony Drive is very well controlled at this time and the staff at JETSA is to be commended. My next comment is spraying along the roadside. On Harmony Drive by the bridge abutment they are spraying and the weeds are all brown and on top of that it's by a stream and herbicides are very dangerous. Phosphate being marketed by Monsanto as "Round Up" is actually a very dangerous chemical. My final comment has to do with the driveway apron into 129 Harmony Drive which is Harmony House. The driveway is becoming difficult to access so I ask that the next time you do a paving job on Harmony Drive that the driveway apron could be improved and we'd be glad to pay the cost for it.

Clair Michaels said, I see that they're hauling logs again down there. **Chairman Baker** said, they're still bonded for hauling. **Michaels** said, that section from what we call White Gate right after you cross over the creek to where they are working. . it's getting pretty bad. **Baker** said, we're looking at doing some patch work down there. We have before pictures of the condition of the road and it was pretty bad prior to the logging.

Supervisor Wallet said, we have been diligently trying to move forward on the Fishing Pond. Our engineer returned responses for all the technical comments made by DEP and everything's been addressed. I've been calling Stacy Greenwald and I just get her message and I've left voice messages and she doesn't return my calls. She's the one that has the permit right now. I contacted their engineer, Charles Colbert. I called him and he did answer his phone and he said Stacy Greenwald's really too busy and hasn't had time to look at it. He assured me that they would look at it when they get time. It's very frustrating. We went to our State Representative to go to the DEP and help this along and they said, they don't want to burn any bridges with DEP. We also talked to our State Senator and nobody wants to engage DEP beyond us. We also had a meeting with a member of US Congressman Rothfus staff and have gotten no response. **Ed Westrick** said, a few of us might. **Wallet** said, I would welcome it and give you the phone number. There's been a lot of investment, effort and time by a lot of people to build something in our own community for our own benefit that the State of Pennsylvania won't act on. **Chairman Baker** said, soon it will be too late to get anything done for this year. **Wallet** said, we are entering prime time to get something done being August and September are usually the driest months of the year for digging a pond. Not only is this a fishing pond but it will be used for fire protection as well. The Fire Company will be putting a dry hydrant there and if anything happens on that end of the Township, they got a real good source of water. There's all kinds of people and businesses willing to pitch in and help with this but we need the permit.
