Public Comments:

Ed Smith said I had a water problem in the basement at 129 Harmony Drive, Harmony House, and you gentlemen responded to me quickly and helpfully and I'm here to say thanks. I wrote an op-ed on sewage in February and I think it's important that you know what's going on in this massive sewage project in the City of Johnstown.

Solicitor Bill Barbin said along time ago municipalities did pressure testing but none of them had over 150 million gallons flow into the river either. There is no other way to stop overflows into the river and the JETSA system proved that. The JETSA system overflowed its pumps every time it rained until they required pressure testing. The same thing is true with the other municipalities. **Smith** said, Johnstown should be the last place that pressure testing should be imposed. I don't know of any other city where they were going to replace their entire sewage system which would be an extremely bold move. If the customers in the city of Johnstown can't pay for this debt, who would pay for it? My purpose was to alert you of a potential financial problem.
