Public Comments:

Bud Watroba asked, what's the Township's view on these outdoor furnaces? Would those fall under the Nuisance Law? . . because where I'm living, it's turned into nothing but a Nuisance for me. **Chairman Baker** answered, the DEP regulates those. **Watroba** said, I talked to DEP and they didn't want to get involved unless I could prove that they're burning garbage and I can't prove that. If they are burning garbage, they burned it all summer long and I couldn't have my windows open in the evening. I can't have my windows open today. It's an entirely an inconvenience and Nuisance to me. **Baker** asked, why were they burning today. . to heat water or to heat a pool? **Watroba** said, I'm thinking a swimming pool. Why should he have a right to have his luxury at my expense? **Baker** said, I know where you live and the location. **Watroba** said, where he put the furnace and enclosed it is partly on the neighbors property so it's really not legal. **Baker** asked, but the garage was existing? **Watroba** replied, yes and built under the previous owners but he built an extension on the back of it to put the furnace in. **Baker** said, the setback could have been previously established with the existing garage. **Watroba** said, I wanted to see what your view was on the outdoor furnaces before I go up and have a discussion with them. I get out of bed in the morning, all I smell is wood burning and when I get home from work, the same thing. There's no chimney on it. .the stack is only six inches out of that roof and when it comes out and hits that roof it goes down straight to the ground and just lays there. **Baker** said, we've discussed this at great length. . the DEP was to regulate those things. . now the newer furnaces are re-burning that smoke before it's ever exhausted. It's not quite the issue. We've talked about making them have higher stacks, chimneys on them, but you can't tell someone to put a 15 foot stack on something the manufacturer says only requires a six foot one. It's a problem and you're not the only one complaining. **Supervisor Wallet** said, we had an issue with someone else out your way and we talked to them and told them to put a higher stack on it and it helped. **Watroba** said, when it gets this time of year and the smoke goes down to the ground it just lays there all night long. **Baker** said, we were just having this conversation yesterday about you and outdoor furnace issues and we wanted to discuss it with the Solicitor tonight but unfortunately something come up and he couldn't make it. Putting up with this through the Summer was bad and like today is a nice day. . you can't have the windows open or you'll just smell the smoke all through my house. It's inconvenient not being able to open the windows in the Summer on hot nights. **Baker** said, I don't have an answer for you tonight but we are concerned about it and other similar situations in the Township. We'll keep you appraised of what we find, where we're headed or what might be possible to do.

Chairman Baker said, we're not finished with the pond yet Ed. **Ed Westrick** asked, how close are we? **Supervisor Wallet** replied, the permits were all sent in and signed and we got an email from the engineer yesterday where we have to pay the Cambria County Conservation District \$2,000 for permits for the County. **Westrick** replied, that's a shame. **Wallet** said, they're charging us so I can't help it. We had to forward three checks - one to the Cambria County Clean Water Fund for \$500, one to the PA Clean Water Fund for \$500 and one to the Cambria County Conservation District for \$1,000. **Westrick** asked, do you feel there's any chance of digging this pond this Fall? **Wallet** said, my gut tells me no. All told, with the permit review. . the DEP has 4 months to review the permits. . now unless we can get the expedited which is very doubtful. . it's October. The whole package has been submitted and we're way ahead of where we were a year ago. Once the permits are approved, we can get started. **Baker** said, we want this as bad as you guys do and we're not going to stop until we get it done.

Chairman Bruce Baker announced, The Board of Supervisors next meetings will be held on Thursday, October 10, 2013 at 8:00 am and Thursday, October 31, 2013 at 7:00 pm at the Jackson Township Municipal Building. The Jackson Township Volunteer Fire Company will host an Open House at the Fire Hall on Wednesday, October 9, 2013 from 6 - 8 pm. There will be Fire Department tours and a chance to meet the firemen, check out the new truck and learn about fire fighting. Kids will be able to tour the smoke trailer or get a free fire truck ride. In addition there will be free refreshments and 911 house ID numbers. Everyone is encouraged to come out and show your support for the Fire Company. A Halloween Parade will be held on Sunday, October 27, 2013 at 1:00 pm in Vinco. Trick or Treat will be held immediately following until 4:00 pm. The Supervisors will be giving out free treats at the Fire Hall.
