Public Comments:

Jolene Dishart said, I emailed several of you about The Tire Outlet issue. They have hundreds of tires. Back in March was the first time I emailed Mr. Dreikorn. Mr. Burkey stopped by yesterday and the tires are still there collecting water and bringing in mosquitos. There are also a lot of junk cars that have been there for years. Some of them are not drained of their fluids and getting into the groundwater. Basically we're sick of living next to a junkyard and I would like something done about it. When Mr. Burkey first said about it, Mr. Rozsi said he would put up a fence and he has not done anything to remedy the situation. **George Burkey** said, I talked to him and he told me he had a guy coming to pick up the tires in a day or so and he would put up a fence. He did take care of some of the stuff and he moved some of the stuff and tires away from her property. I believe he talked to John too. **Vice-Chairman Wallet** said, he asked me what the setback was for a fence on the property, but it hasn't been put up yet. **Chairman Baker** said, we need to send him a letter with a certain amount of time to comply. As far as draining fluids from vehicles, we don't have anything on that. That would fall under the DEP. **Burkey** said, there is a problem with them burning as well. A commercial establishment in Pennsylvania isn't allowed to burn anything. **Dishart** said, the Pennsylvania Code references a junkyard to be the storage of 10 or more unused vehicles. There are some vehicles that have never moved in the 6 years that I lived there. I don't understand why its not a junkyard? I know it's a business where I would expect cars to be coming and going. **Baker** said, as far as a state code, he would be exempt from some of those as we follow the Township Zoning Ordinance and the garage was pre-zoning. Hopefully sending a letter will rectify the problem.

The Supervisors will be giving out free treats at the Fire Hall.
