**Public Comments:**

**Patricia Bartusik** said, I'm here to complain about an outdoor furnace. I think I talked to you on the phone. **Chairman Baker** said, since Mr. Watroba was here at the last meeting, we got some additional information from the Solicitor pertaining to outdoor furnaces and one of the things the State (PaDEP) does regulate is the height of the flue pipe that's on the furnaces which we weren't aware of. In your case, that one's not 10 feet as well as the one Mr. Watroba is having problems with. **Bartusik** said, I talked to him and he added 2 feet but it didn't help. You should see it tonight . . the air is heavy. It comes into the garage, the breezeway and if I open the door, it goes in the kitchen. . it's terrible. He's burning wood, but it's green wood which gives off a sour smell. **Baker** said, we're looking at other options. This could be considered a health issue and smoke's not good for you. In this case, it's about 75 yards, just across Kepple Road. Sometimes getting the stack up high enough will help if it catches that wind. **Bartusik** said, it would have to be as high as the house. **Baker** said, if it's in between houses and the stack's not high enough, you might get wind current, but the smoke will stay low. **Bartusik** said, it was put in about 3 years ago. **Solicitor Barbin** said, there's now a regulation that stopped the sale of regular furnaces and only allows what they call Class II furnaces that apparently burn more and have less smoke. The idea behind the DEP regulation was that you can have outdoor furnaces as long as it has complete combustion and it burns up all the smoke. **Bartusik** said, I just think it should have to be so many feet from someone. If you live way out somewhere, that's one thing but when you got neighbors right across the road. Why can't it be 1,000 feet from another house? **Baker** replied, that's one of the things we're looking at. **Barbin** said, the good furnaces will fully combust. Maybe the DEP could tell by looking at the furnace. **Baker** said, not only are you putting out smoke but there's a lot of heat loss as well. If you burn that, it's more efficient that way. **Barbin** said, we'll tell you what the DEP guy says. **Clair Michaels** said, my boy had one in Vintondale and he used it till he moved out and the neighbors never complained. He burnt dry wood. **Barbin** said, I think that would make a huge difference. **Michaels** said, when it started getting

warm weather, he didn't fire it all summer long so that way you could keep your windows open from sometime in April till October. After that you normally have your windows shut. **Baker** said, but some people heat up electric hot water and swimming pools. **Supervisor Wallet** said, a big part of it is just being a good neighbor and being conscious of the neighbors. I don't burn leaves in my yard when the smoke would blow on the neighbors. **Bartusik** said, it's really bad when you can't go out and walk in your own yard and in the Winter time you still have to go out and shovel snow. You can't go out and get the paper on your way to work. It just doesn't seem fair.
