Ordinance # 16

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING DISORDERLY CONDUCT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF JACKSON AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Township of Jackson hereby ordains as follows:

SECTION 1.

Disorderly conduct is hereby prohibited within the Township of Jackson, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

SECTION 2.

Any person who shall be guilty of any act, word, or conduct causing or intending to cause a disturbance of the peace and good order of the Township, or causing or intending to cause any danger, discomfort or annoyance to any of the inhabitants of the Township or users of the Township streets or thoroughfares; or who shall willfully make any loud, boisterous or unseemly noise or disturbance, or shall fight or quarrel or incite others to fight or quarrel; or who shall publicly make use of obscene or indecent language, or who shall loaf or loiter or congregate upon any of the public streets, highways or alleys or public grounds in the Township of Jackson, to the annoyance of peaceable residents nearby or traveling upon any streets, highways, or alleys or being lawfully upon any of the public grounds in the Township, whereby the public peace is broken or disturbed or the traveling public annoyed, shall be guilty of disorderly conduct.

SECTION 3.

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment of not more than thirty (30) days.
