Ordinance # 19

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING BOYS AND GIRLS UNDER EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS OF AGE TO BE OR REMAIN IN OR UPON ANY STREETS, HIGHWAYS, ALLEYS, PARKS OR PUBLIC PLACES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF JACKSON, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AT NIGHT AFTER THE HOUR OF 10:00 P.M. UNLESS ACCOMPANIED AS HEREIN PROVIDED; PRESCRIBING THE MANNER OF ENFORCEMENT AND FIXING THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

The Township of Jackson hereby ordains as follows:

SECTION 1.

It shall be unlawful for boys and girls under eighteen (18) years of age (such persons being defined for the purpose of this Ordinance as children) to be or remain in or upon any streets, highways, alleys, parks or public places in the Township of Jackson, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, at night after the hour of 10:00 P.M., unless such child is accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person having the legal custody of said child.

SECTION 2.

It is hereby made unlawful for any parent, guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of any child of the age above designated to allow or permit any such child, ward or other person under such age, while in such legal custody, to go or to be in or upon any of the streets, highways, alleys, parks or public places in said Jackson Township after the time prohibited in Section 1 hereof, except as therein provided.

SECTION 3.

(This section amended, see below or ordinance 35.)

Any child as above designated found upon the Township streets, highways, alleys, parks or public places within the Township, in violation of Section 1 of this Ordinance, shall be taken into custody by the Township police and delivered to his or her parents, guardian or person having legal custody of said child, and report thereof made immediately to the Township Police Commissioner, who shall make a record thereof in a book to be kept for that purpose. If said parent, guardian or person having the legal custody of said child shall again allow him or her to be on said streets, highways, alleys, parks or public places in violation of Section 1 of this Ordinance, said parent, guardian or person having the legal custody of said child so offending, shall, upon conviction thereof before a justice of the peace, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars and costs, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than five (5) days at the discretion of the justice of the peace, and a like fine or imprisonment shall be imposed upon any person aiding or abetting in the violation of the intent and purpose of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4.

The police officers of the Township in taking children into custody under this Ordinance shall use their discretion in determining age, and in doubtful cases may require positive proof, and until such proof is furnished, the officer's judgment shall prevail.

SECTION 5.

That Ordinance No. 17 adopted by the Supervisors of Jackson Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, on April 28, 1967, is hereby repealed.

Ordinance # 35

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3 OF ORDINANCE NO. 19 OF JACKSON TOWNSHIP,  
CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ADOPTED THE 15th DAY OF DECEMBER, 1969.

The Township of Jackson, hereby ordains as follows:

SECTION 1.

That Section 3 of Ordinance No. 19 adopted the 15 day of December, 1969, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"Any parent, guardian or person having the legal custody of a child who shall allow or permit said child to be on the streets, highways, alleys, parks or public places in violation of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 19 shall, upon conviction thereof before a justice of the peace, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Five (\$5.00) Dollars and costs for the first offense, and a fine of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and costs for each conviction before a justice of the peace after the first offense and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than five (5) days at the discretion of the justice of the peace, and a like fine or imprisonment shall be imposed upon any person aiding or abetting in the violation of the intent and purpose of this Ordinance."
