Report of a Commission
 New Township

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of
 the Peace held at Chesham for the County of
 Bucks on the second day of October 1828
 The Petition of a Number of the inhabitants
 of Cornbury Sumner Hill & Cornmarsh townships
 in said County. praying that a new township
 be laid out of parts of Cornbury Sumner Hill & Cornmarsh townships
 of aforesaid. Whereupon the Court appointed Stephen Royce David Todd
 and Joseph Burgess to view and lay out the same and make
 report thereon. Who after viewing the same report as follows to wit
 To the Honourable Judges comprising the above Court. We Stephen
 Royce David Todd & Joseph Burgess appointed by the above order
 of Court to view and lay out the new Township therein mentioned
 after being duly sworn. Do report that in pursuance of the said
 order we have viewed and laid out a new Township which we
 name Jackson Township, according to the following boundaries
 according to the boundaries presented in the above order excepting
 alterations Northward of the above mentioned toll gate which
 considering necessary to be made for the accommodation of the
 inhabitants. To wit Beginning at the East end of the above
 mentioned toll gate thence South four Miles to a Cheeky thence
 eight Miles and three furlongs to the Cornmarsh river at
 the place called Solands near the line between Indiana and Bucks
 County thence along said river to said County line thence
 Northward along said County line to the boundary of Surquidun
 Township on the clay Curpish road thence Eastward
 along the said Curpish road to the bridge on the north bank
 of Blacklie thence Northward up said Branch to a birch
 standing on the east bank of said branch directly from the
 said toll gate North thirty four & one half degrees west
 thence North thirty four & one half degrees east to the
 place of beginning.

And if the alterations do not
 meet with the approbation of the Court we say that there
 is no Decree for a New Township according to the boundaries
 proposed. Wherefore we leave it to the discretion of the
 Court to confirm the above boundary or not. Witness our hands
 the third day of January A.D. 1828.
